Russian Minor Assessment Plan

Russian has established the following student learning objectives for the minor:

- 1. Achieve competence in Russian listening, speaking, writing, and reading;
- 2. Acquire broad understanding of the people, movements, and events that have shaped Russian cultural history over the past 1000 years;
- 3. Be acquainted with appropriate critical tools and research skills for analyzing cultural texts on a basic level:
- 4. Express all the above in clear and compelling ways.

Our assessment of these objectives includes:

- 1. Direct assessments by instructors within relevant core and supporting classes, as well as successful completion of the language requirement (at least 204 or its equivalent).
- 2. A review of at least two pieces of written work from at least two advanced courses (beyond 204), selected by students as exemplary of their skills.
- 3. An exit survey completed by minors, normally during the winter or spring term of senior year.
- 4. A discussion by Russian faculty, occurring at least once every three years, focusing on student work, including a review of exit survey results, placed in the context of results from previous years. Discussion will be framed by rubrics, and will focus on one learning objective per cycle.
- 5. A discussion by Russian faculty about what, if anything, might be changed in the curriculum in order to address any general weaknesses.
