

When a classmate came to us with the idea of the Carbon Offset Challenge, we were excited but knew it was unknown territory, and did not know exactly what was in store. While we did not meet our goal of 32 new donors, the enthusiasm from the 21 classmates who gave during this challenge really excited our sponsor, and they decided to offset a portion of the anticipated emissions from classmates' travel to our reunion next summer, equivalent to the portion of the donor goal that was reached, an offset of 75 tons of carbon emissions. Thank you!

We still have the opportunity to break records with our Class Gift to the Alumni Annual Fund. The Fund was vital this year in helping students who needed to stay on campus or create fast travel plans in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. Our final class challenge - **Exit 69** starts Tuesday, 6/9 and goes until Friday, 6/19. We are pulling out all the stops to get to 69% participation and \$619,000. If you haven't yet donated, your gift, **of any size**, earns a \$250 match. If you've already donated, and give again, your gift will garner an additional \$95 match.
